

### **PASTOR'S CORNER**

## The Strong Example of a Loving Father

The Scriptures offer many examples of God's love for His children, but none more miraculously displayed than that of the Father toward the Church. It is a Truth that is so powerful, despite the fact that we as believers have not yet seen the Father, the first person of the Trinity.

It is in God's plan that the family be whole, strong, secure and divine—with the strong presence of a loving father. He is the figure

who primarily holds the key for the blessing and vision of his children. Of course, many mothers have supported and served as heads of households as needed by God's grace, but it was never God's plan for a mother to replace the father. When the father is physically or emotionally absent, there is a great void.

The National Center for Fathering (www.fathers.com) reports that "more than 20 million children live in a home without the physical presence of a father." The U.S. Census Bureau estimate is even higher (24.7 million children or 33% live absent their biological father). And 58% of African-American children live without their biological fathers. Fatherlessness impacts our homes, churches, schools and prisons.

Our comfort as believers is in knowing that regardless of the state of the earthly father, our heavenly Father is always present and close. In the same way, a strong Christian father should exemplify our heavenly Father's attributes, providing close kinship, protection, and security with willing sacrifice, as he faithfully cares for and loves his family.

Despite what the media would project, we do have such examples in the highest leader of the Free World and in many of our homes today. Godly men still choose virtue. In fact, the very term, "virtue," comes from the Latin word for "man," signifying strength and dignity. Without it, a man can be neither a good nor godly father.

As God, our heavenly Father is a great provider, protector and through His Holy Spirit our spiritual leader, so too should the

Christian father provide for his family. He should lead prayer in the home, help cultivate godly character, and — whether physically present or not—leave a godly imprint on each member.

We should be so infused with this Truth that we honor all Christian fathers and encourage them to be the men God has called them to be.

address and feel empowered to address unforeseen health crises or related circumstances."


