Another Reason to Celebrate!

"Commit to the LORD whatever you do, and the LORD will establish your plans." – Proverbs 16: 3

The day was Wednesday, July 14, 2021. And it was truly a day to celebrate!

One of the Asbury faithful walked into our church and said, "Pastor Will, I have something for you." This most generous man reached out his hand and gave me a check made out to Asbury United Methodist Church. The check was in the amount of \$10,000.00!

"Pay off the elevator" was his instruction. And with his gift, which put us over the top, we will do just that!

What an amazing accomplishment for our Church Family and all the folks who need the elevator to safely access our upper and lower levels. I am so proud of Asbury's members and friends who have seen this project through so very quickly.

On June 26, 2019, our church secured a 15-year loan from the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation in the amount of \$290,000.00 and in just over two short years, the loan is PAID IN FULL! And we managed to do this while still maintaining over \$121,000.00 in our Dream Fund!

The next step is for me to meet with the Trustees so that I may share my vision of what I see as phases 2, 3, and 4 as we continue to upgrade our building and grounds. I believe Asbury has wonderful momentum going – even as we come off the pandemic interruption. Consider all that has occurred since we have engaged in ministry together. We implemented an AV system in the sanctuary (started under Pastor Wendee), remodeled and expanded the church kitchen, replaced the aging floor in Fellowship Hall, built a Prairie Gazebo, erected a state-of-the-art digital sign in front of the church, and added a beautiful lectern and Communion table to the sanctuary. And ALL projects have been PAID IN FULL.

God is present and working in our midst! There are so many reasons to celebrate the life of Asbury Church! Thank you to all who so generously contributed to all these projects. May our ministries grow as we serve the world, serve our community, and serve one another in Jesus' name!

August 1 Tenth Sunday After Pentecost

Holy Communion

Scripture: John 6: 25-35 & Ephesians 4: 1-16 Sermon: "Sir, Always Give Us This Bread"

August 8 Eleventh Sunday After Pentecost

War and battles were common in Biblical days. If fact, Scripture refers to the "season when men go to battle." Yet the writer of Ephesians uses the symbolism of armor to promote protection, purity, and peace. Christ has offered a new and better way for living.

August 29 Fourteenth Sunday After Pentecost

Scripture: James 1: 17-27 & Mark 7: 1-8, 14-15 Sermon: "Religion At Its Best ... And Its Worst."

Jesus and James demonstrate what God is really looking for in the faith we live. Jesus teaches the Pharisees that faith is much more than "human rules" and James teaches that faith shapes the way we conduct ourselves and treat our neighbors. Both stress the role of community responsibilities in what they teach.


