Pastor's Pondering

Holy Week Approaches

Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Sunday! It all happens in the month of April.

This is of course, a busy time in the life of the church. Jesus' Passion is coming to its climax and we at Asbury Church will journey with him as we conclude the season of Lent and begin the season of Easter. It will be a time when we celebrate resurrection and the new life it brings both now and for eternity.

We will begin by symbolically entering Jerusalem with our Lord, with shouts of "Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the Highest!"

Palm Sunday was a time of celebration as Jesus made his triumphal entry into the holy city. Yet the celebration was short lived as within days of his arrival, the crowds began to turn on him and the Pharisees began to turn up the heat.

We will remember that day during our Palm Sunday service and explore just how the emotions and attitudes of so many changed so fast concerning our Lord.

On Maundy Thursday, we will have the opportunity to hear again, the story of Jesus and his Last Supper. It was the night when he instituted the Sacrament of Holy Communion, humbly washed the feet of his disciples, and suffered the betrayal by Judas Iscariot which led to his arrest. We will receive Holy Communion at the rail.

Good Friday, that torturous day when Jesus was tried, whipped, and ultimately crucified, will be commemorated with a Service of Tenebrae or Service of Darkness. This is quite possibly the most moving worship experience of the year. The service recounts Jesus' Passion narrative with a powerful text that is accompanied by the extinguishing of 14 candles and finally the Christ Candle, marking Jesus' death on the cross. This worship service is one you will certainly want to experience as it will bring you ever closer to understanding and internalizing, just what Jesus' crucifixion was all about.

Finally, we will gather at 10am on Easter Sunday morning to rejoice and celebrate the discovery of Jesus' empty tomb. We will read the Resurrection account and sing all our favorite hymns for the day.

I do hope that you will spend as much time as you can with your Asbury Church Family during this exciting and dramatic time of Life, Death, and Resurrection. You will be drawn ever closer to your Lord and Savior during these important worship opportunities!

Let us continue our Journey with Jesus and learn of his love for each of us.

Service of Tenebrae.


April 17 Easter Sunday 10am Worship

2022 CROP HUNGER WALK

- 25% of the funds raised will stay here locally to help with hunger concerns through ECHO.
- 75% is used by Church World Service for global relief and sustainable projects to help eliminate hunger. A portion of this year's proceeds will also help with the Ukraine relief.

We will be having an in-person, outdoor walk this year with adaptations to ensure social distancing and masking. The walk will begin at Cargill UMC on April 24, 2022, starting at 1:30 p.m. and checkout for finish should be before 3:30 p.m. Sign-in begins at 1:00.


Changes for this year - Everyone will be required to wear masks when entering Cargill for signin. Walkers should check in and immediately exit the hall through the north hall and out the door on the north side of the building. Maps of suggested routes will be on the table. Walkers are free to make their own adaptations. Everyone can start their walk after checking in. If you plan to walk as a team, you will need to wait outside in the front of the building, practicing social distancing. There will be no large group send off this year. Walkers should return to check in through the west entrance as before.

Ministry Start Date: The Crop Project was organized in 1947 when farmers were asked to donate food and seed crops to our hungry neighbors in post-World War II Europe and Asia, a program that soon became known as the Christian Rural Overseas Program - CROP. In 1969 in Bismarck, North Dakota, and in 1970 in York, Pennsylvania, the first walk events were organized to raise funds to support CROP. Since then, CROP Hunger Walk events have been held in hundreds of communities large and small raising millions of dollars to eradicate hunger and poverty.


9 People attended - children and adults. We used 3 tables to spread out. Some of the games played - Cribbage, Sequence, Sorry, and Spoons.
