"For I know the plan I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me with all your heart." Jeremiah 29: 11-13

Providing us with hope and a future! That is at the core of what our God is all about. When troubles weigh heavily upon us, it does us well to keep this simple truth in mind: That in God, there is found hope and a future.

Scripture, like life itself, contains story after story of ordinary people facing extraordinary challenges of life. Many of those challenges are no fault of their own, yet they exist as barriers before them, and they can lead to a sense of hopelessness and despair. Sometimes the challenges simply seem too great.

Yet the message of our God is that with God in our lives, hope is always present. With God, strength is found. With God, we have an ever-present advocate; One who listens to our prayers and raises us up in our time of trouble. This is at the core of the Good News!

Jesus Christ's ministry focused on bringing people this very hope. By feeding the hungry, healing the sick, and forgiving the sinner, he changed the course of life for hurting people. He gave them reason to press on with confidence when faced with uncertainty about that which lies ahead. As followers of Jesus Christ – as his Church – it becomes our mission to bring that same sense of hope to those in need this very day.

I especially like the words chosen by St. Peter as he closes out his first epistle. He writes:

"And the God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm, and steadfast. To him be the power for ever and ever. Amen." 1 Peter 5: 10-11

What might we say – what might we do – to bring to others this Good News?

Scripture: Acts 2: 1-21 & 1 Cor 12: 3b-13 Sermon: "Discovering Our Spiritual Gifts"





Asbury Book Club book choice in May is *A Gentlemen in Moscow* by Amor Towles. From the New York Times bestselling author of Rules of Civility—a transporting novel about a man who is ordered to spend the rest of his life inside a luxury hotel.

A Gentleman in Moscow immerses us in another elegantly drawn era with the story of Count Alexander Rostov. When, in 1922, he is deemed an unrepentant aristocrat by a Bolshevik tribunal, the count is sentenced to house arrest in the Metropol, a grand hotel across the street from the Kremlin.

Rostov, an indomitable man of erudition and wit, has never worked a day in his life, and must now live in an attic room while some of the most tumultuous decades in Russian history are unfolding outside the hotel's doors.

Unexpectedly, his reduced circumstances provide him with a doorway into a much larger world of emotional discovery. Brimming with humor, a glittering cast of characters, and one beautifully rendered scene after another, this singular novel casts a spell as it relates the count's endeavor to gain a deeper understanding of what it means to be a man of purpose.

Ministry Start Date: Construction began in October of 1999 and opened for ministry in the year 2000.




