Pastor's Pondering

Division hurts. Disagreement strains relationships.

Whether it happens in a family, in a community, or as

St. Paul witnessed, in a church, divisions and disagreements risk devastating and possibly permanent damage to the love and unity which God desires for all creation.

Time and again, Jesus returned to the central theme of his ministry and mission: "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." – John 13: 34b and again: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you." – Luke 6: 27b.

A big part of "loving" is unity. That is the unceasing effort to be understanding, inclusive, and accepting of others even when their perspective clashes with our own. We all know this effort can be very trying and difficult. It requires that we be willing to walk in another's shoes with an open and compassionate heart and mind.

Until a few years ago, I had never heard the term "disaffiliation." Now, the term is heard often in certain United Methodist circles. I haven't mentioned disaffiliation much at Asbury Church mainly because the differences within our Church Family bring us nowhere near such a drastic and devastating "solution" as disaffiliation demands. I am thankful to witness so much more unity in our congregation than disunity. Unfortunately, this is not the case in some of our United Methodist churches.

I continue to celebrate what has been a hallmark of Methodism since the days of John Wesley. That is the ability of our denomination to exist as a large and welcoming tent, under which people of all persuasions come together in unity despite our differences. I continue to celebrate the diversity of people and ideas and theologies hanging together for the goal of loving one another as Christ commanded.

If is said that John Wesley coined the phrase, "Agree to disagree." I think that that phrase is not only wise but is necessary if we are to be a church which lives by our slogan, "Open hearts, open minds, open doors."

I found the following prayer online at biblestudytools.com. I think it is worth sharing.

"God, we need you. Some days feel so broken and uncertain. We're hurting, we're struggling, and we're aware, more than ever, of our own weaknesses, and of the dark forces that constantly surround us, fighting to gain ground in our lives and families. We choose to stand our ground today and say, "no more." We ask for your help to set aside our differences and look to the greater cause, the cause of Christ. We ask that you would help us to truly live a life of love. We ask that you surround this country and cover us with your mighty hand. We pray for unity in our land, that in spite of our differences, we would be willing to stand strong together and live out our days with compassion and grace. Remind us to live aware, to redeem the time, listen to your words, and be willing to make a difference in this land. Give us the courage to speak out. Amen."

Scripture: Genesis 45: 1-15 & Matthew 15: 10-28 Sermon: "The Rewards of Forgiveness and Faith"

Yet again, our two Scripture readings highlight two well-known stories: Joseph making himself known to his brothers and Jesus healing a woman of faith from outside the Israelite community. We will discover what can be found when we forgive and when we express our life of faith.

August 27 Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost 10AM Worship

Scripture: Exodus 1: 8 - 2: 10 & Matthew 16: 13-20

Sermon: "Moses and Peter: Two Unlikely Children of God"

Our two Scripture readings today highlight two important Biblical figures: Moses and Peter. Both men become God's chosen to build God's kingdom at different times in Biblical history. We will examine how God can use ordinary people in extraordinary ways for God's purposes.


