Pastor's Pondering

Can you believe how time flies!

We just finished bringing down the Christmas decorations and already I find myself thinking about planning for Lent!!

It all begins this year on February 14^{th} – Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday!

One might find it a bit ironic that on the same day that we celebrate our love for one another, we also acknowledge our mortality and sinful nature. They would appear on the surface to be pulling us in two very different ways. I suppose that would be true, if it were not for the fact that the love of God for each of us is much more powerful than the reality of sin and death.

What we begin that night is a journey which takes us through the sacrificial death of God's beloved Son, Jesus Christ – He loved us so deeply, that he was willing to die that we might live – and ends with the triumphant victory which we celebrate on Easter morning! What we will learn is that the greatest love – God's love for us – is not always easy. It includes pain, sacrifice, and even death, but ends with resurrection, joy, and eternal life. That, my friends, is love!

During Lent 2024, we will walk with Jesus through the Stations of the Cross. We have not done this since 2018. This journey will take us through 14 "stations" or events which are Biblically supported, which Jesus endured between Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.

I am very excited to walk with each of you and gain new insight into that painful trek of love and commitment which Jesus endured solely because he loved and trusted his Father and was willing to endure anything to grant us the gift of resurrection life.

I do hope you will join us beginning February 14th (bring your sweetheart to church that night) for our tradition of a 6 p.m. Soup and Sandwich meal followed by Worship at 7 p.m..

Asbury UMC is the place to be during this most important season of Spiritual Growth and Recommitment to Discipleship.


Scripture: Mark 8: 31-38 & Psalm 22: 23-31



Ministry Start Date: 1994. They are Rock County's only free & charitable clinic. It has provided comprehensive health services to the underserved.

Ministry Mission: HealthNet of Rock County, Inc. is dedicated to excellence and innovation in the provision of primary health and dental care and health education, delivered free or at low cost, to enhance the quality of life for the underserved residents of Rock County, Wisconsin.

WHAT THEY HAVE DONE:

- Provided over 23,567 prescriptions worth an estimated \$1.5 million annually to prevent health care crisis situations.
- Reduced the number of ER visits for 74% of our patients that consider HealthNet their medical home.
- Enrolled patients into the <u>Badger Care Core Plus</u> program or placed them on the appropriate waiting list.
- Implemented a new policy for patients to verify that they are uninsured by providing a denial letter from the State program. This ensures that HealthNet is complying with contract requirements and that there is no duplication of service.
- Ensure that our patients overall health status whether it be for diabetes or hypertension is improving with a population health focus.
- Services Offered: Medical Clinic, General Primary Health Care, Mental Health Care Pediatrics, Vision Care, Medications, Health Education.
- Dental Clinic: Teeth Cleaning, Fluoride and Sealant Treatments, Fillings Dental X-rays, Extractions.
- Behavioral Health Clinic: Individual Counseling, Group Therapy, EDMR (Trauma Responsive) Substance Use/MAT




