(The refrain from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel"

"O Come, O Come Emmanuel" has always been one of my favorite Advent/Christmas hymns. From a musical perspective, I find its melody beautiful in a kind of haunting way. To me, it conveys a "feeling" hat something "other-worldly" is about to happen. As a youngster, I remember singing it in church on many Christmas Eves, with lights turned low and candles dancing, all adding to the moment's sacred experience.

The hymn's message is a prayer for, and proclamation about, the coming of the Savior into our world. What a joyful and beautiful message it is!

While the baby Jesus was born to the virgin Mary over 2000 years ago, the message is one Christians herald each and every year, for it is our deepest desire to invite the Son of God to come to us yet again. It is our greatest need to welcome Emmanuel into our hearts.

Jesus Christ is coming into our world yet again.

He is coming to bring us Hope, for we need hope to face our tomorrows.

He is coming to bring us Peace, for peace calms the nations, as well as our hearts and minds and souls.

He is coming to bring us Joy, for joy produces a happy home.

He is coming to bring us Love, for love is at the heart of everything Jesus taught and did.

May we all have a blessed Advent and Christmas season as we prepare our hearts to receive our Savior.
