Pastor's Thanksgiving Message

The Apostle Paul issues this challenge to all the followers of Jesus Christ. At times it is difficult to be thankful. Especially when life presents challenges. But amid these challenges, Paul reminds us to always "give thanks."

What are you most thankful for right now? I know that I am thankful for all of you who make up our Asbury Church Family.

Paul was very intentional about giving thanks often. In fact, almost every one of the Biblical letters attributed to Paul offer words of thanks, usually for the people of the church to whom he was writing. Paul knew that for ministry to happen, it takes a team of people working together to spread the Gospel and see to the needs of one another. And for that team he gives thanks.

Let's all be intentional in giving thanks – especially during this Thanksgiving month. Each of us has been blessed with much, for we have a most giving God – a God who loves us so much, that he gave us his Son, that we might have life and have it abundantly.

May we be reminded of the message of Psalm 100:

"Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth.

Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs.

³ Know that the Lord is God.

It is he who made us, and we are his^[a]; we are his people, the sheep of his pasture.

⁴ Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise;




