"The Power of Prayer"

Do you know that *praying on a consistent basis*, at least twice/day opens up new neuro-pathways that *provide healing spiritually and physically*? Do you know that there is a great *diversity of Christian prayer practices* developed since the Lord taught the disciples how to pray, which allow us to *cross-fit our prayer life*? Similar to physical training, the health benefits of prayer require spiritual discipline using a variety of ways: *praying with Scripture; Prayer Walks; praising with song; journaling and silent conversations with God.* God calls us into spiritual relationship that is personally beneficial when we make prayer a priority. I am not referring to materialistic benefit. However, *we may understand generosity* differently when deeply impacted by a healthy prayer practice.

The *month of October* will be a busy time in which prayer needs to be the foundation of all of our activities. *Mission Matters* will focus on *Healthnet* to raise funds for a much needed dental *X-ray Sensor* serving those in our community. The *Holy Sock Collection for recycling donations* to Northcott Neighborhood Ministry will be *ongoing*. The food pantry at ECHO constantly requires food, financial and volunteer donations. I would like to propose that we *collect food donations each month and consecrate each Sunday we celebrate Communion*.

The *Harvest Dinner will be held on October 18, 3:30 to 6:00 pm* in Fellowship Hall, so "all hands on deck" to make this fundraiser a success to upgrade the AV equipment with a new camera system. In addition, on *November 1 at Milton UMC*, we are invited to participate in a *Rice Pack Event sponsored by our Circuit* of the surrounding UMC Churches in Janesville, Beloit, and Milton. Look for more information on that event soon!

We will focus on *Generosity as the foundation of Stewardship* as we prayerfully consider what to pledge for 2026 ministry support. This year we will be hosting the *Charge Conference with Plymouth UMC* yoked by the same pastor. We will hold a *joint worship service at 10:00 am on Sunday, October 5*, followed by the *business meeting for each church, and then a luncheon* with time for fellowship. In 2026, Asbury and Plymouth will be working on how to share the cost of a full-time pastor and support ways to develop ministries that renew the life of each church with a NexGen priority. *For now, let us begin with prayer.* Amen.


UMF equips women for leadership. Members connect online as well as in local, district, and regional groups that meet in person and/or virtually. (info@uwfaith.org)



When individuals prolong treatment or choose not to seek care because of the fear associated with incurring debt from medical bills, the community suffers in the loss of productive employees, consumers, parents, and healthy members of the community.


