## *From the Pastor's Pen...*



Beginning June 1<sup>st</sup>, we will kick off the **Mission Possible Stewardship Campaign** which will challenge us to catch the vision of eliminating our church mortgage in five years. This campaign was introduced at our April Membership Meeting and embraced enthusiastically by our church body. This campaign challenges us to look to the future realizing there are many ministries we are unable to do because we are hampered by our church debt. We realize that it is God's desire for us to be debt-free and to use the resources that our church body gives to extend His kingdom.

We presented some of those areas of ministry that are hindered by our current church debt: extensive mission opportunities, van/bus ministry, additional staff to facilitate ministry, aggressive marketing and community ministry, Youth Summits, Preaching Conferences, additional concerts/retreats, etc.

The **Mission Possible Campaign** challenges each family to contribute \$25.00 more per week to the principal of our mortgage (in addition to their tithe and current giving to the principal). Our figures are based on 65 families participating at an additional \$25.00 per week towards the principal of the mortgage. If this takes place, the debt will be eliminated in five years. Our current (as of March 31, 2019) mortgage stands at \$727,833.10. While some families may not be able to give an additional \$25.00 per week, some will be able to give more. We believe we can achieve this average giving and with God's grace we can eliminate this debt. What seems impossible today will become possible as God's people catch the vision and prove His faithfulness.

Join me in prayer as we begin this campaign. As we move closer to eliminating our debt, we will become better equipped to carry out our church vision statement: **A Church united to enjoy God's grace and extend His glory**. We have, indeed, enjoyed the grace of God, now may we join hearts in prayer that we might eliminate this debt so that we can **extend His glory** more effectively.

Greetings from the FBC Leadership Team,

This past month we celebrated Resurrection Sunday. A day we worship and praise God for raising Christ from the dead after His crucifixion. In Sunday school class on that day we looked at the events surrounding the resurrection as recorded in Matthew 28 which caused us to think about: Why is Jesus' resurrection important to us? We know Jesus had to die as payment for our sins but does the resurrection have anything to do with payment for sins? How does it affect the way we live on a daily basis? Do we even think about it daily or is the resurrection something we celebrate only once a year?

Jesus says in the gospels that He is God, He is the only way to salvation, the Old Testament is about Him, and He would be raised from the dead on the third day – His resurrection validates all of these claims. His resurrection validates the scriptures and our faith. Paul writes in 1Cor. 15:14 **And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain.**

Paul also writes in 1 Cor. 15:17: **And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins** and in Romans 4:24-25 **Jesus our Lord, who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification.** His resurrection is the reason we are forgiven and justified before God.

Everything hinges on the empty tomb. We are alive in Him, have our faith, and are forgiven because He is not dead. These are the things that we should remind ourselves about every day as the truth of Christ resurrection and its meaning brings us to joy and worship of our Lord.

## Men's Ministry

Join us for our new study entitled **"Echoes of the Reformation"** which begins on Wednesday evening, May 1st @ 6:30 pm. This study will include video-driven studies that provide small-group experiences, individual study, and applicable Scripture. Here is a brief synopsis of this upcoming study: It has been five hundred years since Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the door of the All Saints' Church in Wittenberg, Germany. Luther's theses called for the reform of the church and served as the catalyst for the Protestant Reformation. Its impact is still felt today.

This Bible study examines the five core truths that came from the Reformation, now referred to as the *solas*. Group members will explore these essential convictions of the faith and emerge more immersed in the gospel of Jesus Christ. The *solas* include:


*Sola Scriptura* (by Scripture alone)

*Sola gratia* (by grace alone)

*Sola fide* (through faith alone)

*Solus Christus* (through Christ alone)

*Soli Deo gloria* (glory to God alone)



As you'll see in this study, the *solas* are more than cold Latin terms that academics throw around in church-history books. The five *solas*, like the Reformation itself, are intensely practical. They were the DNA of the Reformation and are still the DNA of the church today. They are grounded in a real-life, every day following of Jesus. They're the most important, basic scriptural truths you can ever believe. We stand on the shoulders of Christians in the past and knowing where we came from will help us keep moving forward with passion and biblical clarity. Come and join us!
